There is a lot of people out there that find it hard to buy enough firewood for the winter. We have a fire wood saving scheme that people who qualify can participate in, to save for next years firewood supply from a certified firewood yard. We spent the night settling in, and then on Tuesday we headed out to Picton, where we caught a boat over to Lochmara Lodge Wildlife Recovery & Arts Centre. We spent an awesome day checking out the attractions, including watching eels being fed, and being able to get into an enclosure with Red Crowned Kakariki and have them feed out of our hands! Wednesday brought us an Easter Egg hunt, and in the afternoon fun with makeup, where the girls got very creative.

Thursday saw a fishing trip, where everyone caught at least one fish, and we ate some of our catch for tea. Yum! In amongst the activities, we had plenty of time to enjoy fishing off the jetty belonging to the house we stayed in, as well as kayaking and rowing about in the dinghy, and of course lots of swimming and snorkelling. BARB WHIPP: THE MULTI-TASKER



In June 2000, I suffered a back injury that I had to have surgery for. I had to eventually retrain, as my previous job as a caregiver with the elderly was no longer an option. I started my journey with KFT on the 1st June 2004, and haven't looked back

since. To be honest, the relief of having a job again was so huge, I don't think I even thought about how long I expected to be here!

Having a back injury can put people at risk of long term unemployment. So I don't think I had any expectations as such, but I have to say I'm really happy to still be here 11 years on. Most of our staff have been here long term, so we have evolved into an extended family, in the best sense of the word. And a lot of us have disabilities. Not too many employers want to take on staff who are in less than perfect health, and I love the fact that the Trust will provide employment opportunities for people with disabilities. I think the thing I enjoy the most is the variety of work I get to do, from doing my fundraising work, to training to learn how to facilitate programmes, as well as being a Camp Leader on our camps, and being involved with our youth group.

## FIREWOOD SAVINGS SCHEME 2016!

For those on pensions, low incomes, or suffering hardship, we provide a solution to being able to obtain fire-wood!

Households save with us weekly for **next** year's firewood, and for every \$3.50 saved, they will get \$1 added to their total! Households can save what they can afford, and have the pressure of choosing and co-ordinating a firewood supplier removed, as we do it all! We arrange for payment and delivery through approved firewood companies that have high quality, properly seasoned firewood, and are looking for sponsorship to provide a wood supply to those in need for this winter whilst they save for next year's firewood.

This service is available in Christchurch, North Canterbury, Ashburton and Hokitika at this stage; we are hoping to be able to expand on the areas we can provide this service to as this service grows.
